

# The Halachic Prenup

#### What's the Halachic Prenup?

The Halachic Prenup is a legal agreement which goes into effect in the unfortunate event of a contested Jewish divorce.

Each spouse agrees to appear before a specific beit din and abide by its decision with respect to the get.

There is also a reciprocal version of the Halachic Prenup which provides the same financial disincentive for a wife who refuses to participate in the get process.

#### Who can serve as a witness?



Anyone outside of your immediate family may serve as a witness. Asking a close friend to serve as a witness is also a great way to honor them.

#### Where do I find a notary?

### Does the Halachic Prenup have rabbinic support?

Yes! The Prenup was drafted by Rabbi Mordechai Willig, in consultation with Rabbi Zalman Nechama Goldberg. Rabbis from the Rabbinical Council of America (RCA) will only officiate at weddings in which a halachic prenup was signed.

#### Does the Halachic Prenup work?

Yes! Even in difficult circumstances, the halachic prenup allows for a faster and more smooth divorce process. It is also enforceable in both Jewish and civil court.

The optional sections of the prenup authorize the Beth Din of America (BDA) to have jurisdiction over settling finances and custody instead of a civil court.
