As you may have imagined, due to Covid-19, ORA is not facilitating prenups in our office at this time. With that said, we are still fully committed to ensuring that engaged couples get the help they need to sign the Prenup.

Unable to go to a notary in person? Please note, while **online notarizations** are not legal in New York State, a NY resident can still obtain a virtual notarization from another state by using this [website](#). This can be very convenient in our coronavirus era. Please note that while usually two witnesses are needed for the prenup, the notarization is MORE important and if need be, one can sign the prenup with only one, or no witnesses. A prenup is always more ideal than a postnup.
